

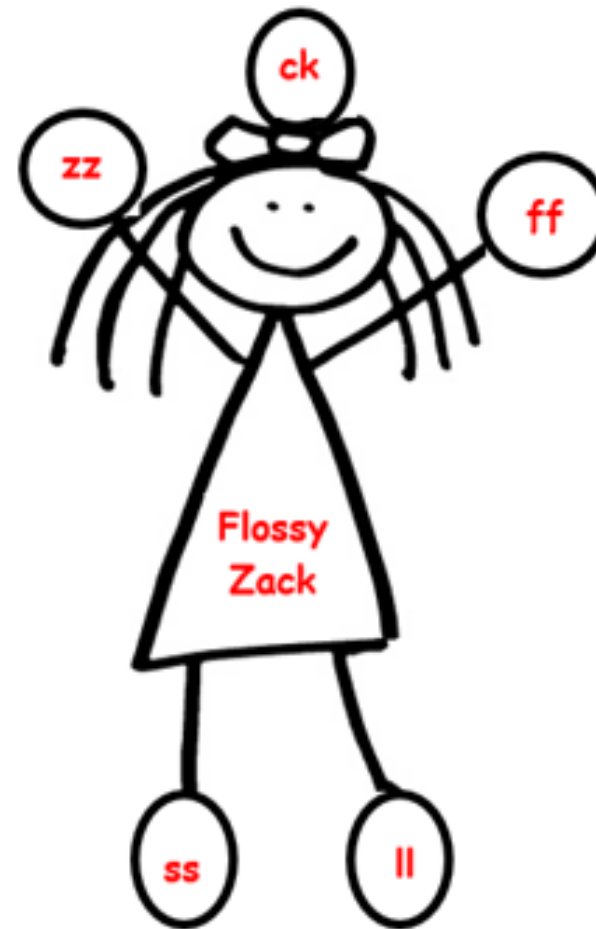
Double the letters **f, l, s, z** at the end of a one syllable word with a short vowel sound.

Do not double the letter k ... use curly /k/ and kicking /k/... the letters c and k together: **ck**

Unless there is a consonant right before the /k/ - then we use letter k on it's own (see the section /k/ at the end of a word) *for example drink.*
